## Monday April 20

1. When do you spend time meeting together with other Christians?

Read Hebrews 10:23-25

2. How does this passage encourage and also challenge your attitudes to meeting with God's people?
3. What is one thing that currently gets in the way of prioritising meeting with God's people?

Give thanks for the privilege of being able to meet together without persecution. Ask that God would keep shaping you to love his people more.

## Tuesday April 21

Read Psalm 133

1. What are things that stop God's people living in unity?
2. How can you take steps to continue to be united with your brothers and sister spiritually while not being together physically?
3. Write down the name of fellow Christians that you're thankful for. Also write down some Christians who've been significant in your journey.

Spend time praying for those people you wrote down. Ask that God might use you in others lives, and use them in yours.

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## Wednesday April 22

Read Genesis 1:26-27

1. What does the language of 'us' in these verses shows us about who God is, and who we are?
2. What is one practical way you could create time and space in your week to meet with and encourage a brother or sister in Christ?
3. Who is one person you can intentionally connect with regularly and share about life and faith?

Give thanks for the relationship you have with the triune God. Ask for his help to intentionally meet with other Christians regularly.

## Thursday April 23

Read Psalm 60

1. What stands out from this Psalm to you?
2. How does this Psalm put into words feelings you may be feeling or have felt at some point, or words you know a fellow Christian may be feeling?
3. In what ways could this Psalm help us to walk alongside someone who is struggling in their faith?

Spend time in prayer for those you know who are in need of God's help. Then take a moment to get in contact with them.

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## Friday April 24

Read 1 John 1:2-7

1. Reflect on the importance of meeting together that you've heard and read about this week. What has struck you the most?
2. How do these verses in 1 John link fellowship with Jesus and fellowship with one another together?
3. Spend time writing down a plan for how you'll maintain helpful rhythms in your life of meeting together with God's people. Remember to make it realistic, and that it's not done out of guilt. Consider what attitude you will seek to have to these interactions also.

Commit this to God in prayer and ask for His help. Pray that your fellowship with others will flow from deep fellowship with God.
