MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Welcome to the start of term 2!

What an encouraging Easter weekend we shared together at St Faith's in April. It was such a joy to see many visitors join with us in remembering Jesus' sacrificial death and celebrate his resurrection and the hope it brings for those who trust in Jesus. A big thank you to all who served in various ways across the Easter weekend.

This month we launch into our term 2 teaching series from the Old Testament book of Exodus. Adam has prepared our studies for this series as we zoom in on the first half of the book this term. Adam comments at the start of the study booklet, saying:

Exodus is a marvellous part of the Old Testament. It is full of richness about God, who he is, and what he is like. Ultimately, Exodus is about a God working sovereignly to save a special people for his own glory. He did back then, and he still does today. That is what he is doing in the church!

“You yourselves have seen what I did to Egypt, and how I carried you on eagles' wings and brought you to myself. Now if you obey me fully and keep my covenant, then out of all nations you will be my treasured possession. Although the whole earth is mine, you will be for me a kingdom of priests and a holy nation. These are the words you are to speak to the Israelites.” (Exodus 19:4-6)

I'm really looking forward to digging deep into this part of God's word as we continue to track the journey of God's chosen people, picking up where we left off last year following our series in Genesis. Study material is available from the foyer at church or on the website. If St Faith's is your church family and you're not a part of a midweek Community Group, I would love you to prayerfully consider joining a group. These groups are the 'engine room' of our church community where we dig deep into God's word, spend time praying for one another, caring for one another and doing life together as the people of God. If you're interested in finding our more, please speak with Adam or myself and we can help find a group that will be suitable for you.

This month our staff team will be attending the Reach Australia National Conference on the Central Coast. We will gather with other church teams from all over Australia to encourage one other as we seek to serve God and his people. Please pray for our staff and ask that this might be a renewing and refreshing time for our team as we're fed from God's word, learn from others in panels, workshops and other networking opportunities.

I look forward to seeing you at church on the weekend.

SOULIES @ KYCK

During the recent school holidays, some of our Soulies senior crew (from years 10-12) travelled up to Katoomba with their leaders for the KYCK youth conference. The weekend away is an annual event where youth have the opportunity to join with over a thousand of their peers + leaders to hear great Bible teaching, and to grow in their faith in Jesus.

It was an excellent weekend away together. This year's speakers: Alan Au (North-Ryde Presbyterian), Ben Staunton (ConnectNT Darwin), & Daniel Leach (Narrabeen Baptist) preached from the New Testament book of Philippians. Together, they did an excellent job of walking us through the apostle Paul's perspective on "joy" - it's certainly a counter-intuitive one. The Apostle Paul suffered much, was persecuted, and imprisoned for telling people about Jesus, but he considered it pure joy, because of his union with Christ. It was a great reminder for our crew that, in spite of our circumstances, real joy is found in Jesus.



Rejoice in the Lord always. I will say it again: Rejoice! Let your gentleness be evident to all. The Lord is near. Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus."

Philippians 4:4-7

It was good to be reminded of that joy as we live in a culture obsessed with pursuing a lesser kind of happiness. The kind of happiness we often pursue is transient and dependent on circumstance. When I'm playing with a new toy, eating something amazing, relishing good relationships, enjoying good health, or loving good results at school - happiness ensues. But when those things cease, happiness goes wanting. I reckon that's what differentiates that kind of happiness from the joy we were reminded about at KYCK. Joy in Christ persists in spite of circumstances. What I eat, what toys I have (or don't have), my relationships, or results at school don't impact it, because it isn't dependent on those things. Our joy in Christ is complete & untouchable - Who wouldn't want that?

Much of the fruit from a weekend away like this is cultivated through conversations in the mundane moments: car trips, walking up to site, waiting in line for a coffee, or relaxing together at night after the session. It's in these moments that youth and their leaders debrief about the bible teaching they've just heard, and spitball how it might play out in their lives. "What will it look like to recognise the joy they have in Christ in all circumstances? As Christians at Soulies? School? Home?" These kinds of conversations happened throughout the weekend - something to praise God for.

Please be praying for the Soulies crew - that they might look to Jesus as their joy, and give thanks for another excellent weekend away together. ■





ESL UPDATE

1) Why is ESL an important part of our mission as a church?

ESL (English as a Second Language) started at St Faiths five years ago with encouragement from both Anglicare and Bishop Edwards. It was realised that there were many people in our local area who either could not speak English, or lacked the fluency needed to enable them to function well in the community. These people were marginalised and often isolated. Many also needed friendship and acceptance. Many too, had not heard of Jesus, or had no understanding of the gospel. Providing classes to these people therefore, was a way to reach into the community, to fulfil a very real need, and also a way to show Christ's love to them, providing opportunities for them to hear the gospel, and to come to know Jesus as their Lord and Saviour.

2.) How has ESL been going over the last two years with the interruption of COVID?

During the first three years, we were amazed at the variety of students that God sent to St Faiths, and we expanded to three class levels with numbers up to about 35 per week. However in the last two years, Covid has greatly impacted our students. In 2020 we ran face to face classes for three out of our four terms, with a number of teachers taking the initiative to run classes on Zoom for one term. Similarly, in 2021, we only had two face to face terms of class, and one on Zoom.

Over these past two years many of our students returned to their home countries, and our numbers greatly reduced, but as we had social distancing, the smaller numbers worked better in our classes and we were able to grow good relationships with a number of students.

The Zoom classes also enabled us to reach students at home, who would usually be at work and unable to attend it expanded our outreach . and in fact we had students joining in from Brazil, Columbia, and Bali.

3.) How have you seen God at work through this ministry?

When we started ESL, we couldn't have envisaged the blessings of this ministry. There seemed to be so many obstacles! However we have constantly seen God's hand at work in the many students that have passed through the church door.

As well as the joy in seeing our students progress, we have been able to walk alongside them, as they have faced the challenges of sickness, of loss, of the deaths of loved ones at home with Covid, of searching for a job, or of trying to get a visa to stay in Australia. Each week we pray for them, we pray with them at morning tea, and we tell them that we love Jesus. We thank God when they ask about Jesus, when they stay back for Bible Study, and when they want to come to church.

Though we run group classes, this is actually a ministry of one to one relationship building, by showing Christ's love to each and every student, of welcoming them and caring for them, and introducing them to their Heavenly Father.

At the end of 2021, we had seen over 187 students in our classes from 32 different countries! Who would have thought there were that many nationalities on the Northern Beaches? Covid may have stopped the planes, but it didn't stop God from bringing people from "every tribe and nation" to the backyard of St Faiths!

4). What help do you need to help this great ministry even better, and how can we be praying for ESL?

As we get back into routine with classes in 2022, we need to rebuild our student numbers, and to make our classes known in the community.

We pray that people will be keen to tell others about the classes; that they will seek out people in their neighbourhood and invite them to ESL.

We also pray that more people will join our ESL Team. We have an amazing team of dedicated ESL teachers, for whom we thank God. However some are taking (well earned) holidays , and others are juggling other commitments.

We also seek prayer, that God will send the students that He has chosen for our classes, that He will empower us to be effective teachers, and that He will create opportunities for us to speak of Jesus and His love for them. ■

Alpha

Alpha is coming up again this month! Starting Tuesday 10th May 7:30pm-9pm. It's been two terms since we've run Alpha in person as COVID and natural disasters have proved to be very inconsiderate in our plans, so please pray that nothing gets in the way and we can run Alpha as planned.

Alpha is the perfect place to invite your friends and family who are curious about the Christian faith, seeking answers, or if you're looking for a refresher on the basics. For the first time, Marcus will be giving talks live instead of the videos, condensing the 10 weeks of Alpha into 4 weeks and presenting it in a way that will adapt it to our Australian culture.

While the presentation will be different, the content is the same - the Gospel! And the format will also be the same. People will be arriving from 7:30pm to find a table, have a seat, and then grab some dinner. This is so key in making Alpha successful, because it's the honest and loving conversation that happens around the table that can make a bigger impact on an individual than the talks themselves. We want to provide an atmosphere where it's safe to share honest opinions, and our guests feel loved and listened to even when they disagree. If you're bringing a friend and missed the Alpha training (or need a refresher), let me remind you of a few tips on how to be a good host.

1. Give ample opportunities for guests to speak.
2. Listen well! Don't interrupt, but encourage them to 'tell you more'.
3. Don't get offended or defensive, be confident in God's Spirit and His powerful Word. If someone says something you disagree with, don't say 'that's wrong', just say 'tell me more why you think that?'
4. Don't have all the answers. People want to feel listened to, not preached at. Understanding their question is more important than giving the right answer. Before you give an answer, ask them first 'can i tell you what i think about that?'
5. Be vulnerable and share well. People won't always feel like sharing, that's ok. You can set an example of what helpful sharing looks like - share some of the things you liked about the talk, or things you found hard, or questions you've had. This will help people to realise that you don't need all the answers.

PARISH COUNSEL UPDATE

Our newly elected Parish Council has met once since our AGM in March. At this meeting we spent time reviewing and prioritising the various questions and suggestions which were raised by parishioners at the AGM for future meetings and consideration. We considered and discussed a draft social media policy for use at St Faith's following advice from the diocese. The Parish Council have also spent parts of the last two meetings thinking through the future vision and mission of St Faith's. As we seek to move forward in this, we ask for your prayers for God's wisdom and direction. Finally, a financial update was provided to the Parish Council noting that our income and expenses are on budget to the end of February, for which we give thanks to God!

Praise God for the installation of our Tesla solar panel battery that will store the power that is generated from our solar panels on the northern roof of our main building. A big thank you to Rod Bale for his work in overseeing this project which lasted for around two years, involved working with government officials and grant paperwork, Anglican Church head office, local providers, our administration team and much more! We are thankful for the provision of both a state and federal grant that largely covered the costs of this project. Now all we need is that big yellow thing in the sky to reappear.....

Over our next few meetings, we will continue discussion on vision and mission, with a particular focus on generating 'mission heat' as a parish and the important task of equipping people for ministry and service. Various members of our staff team have been invited to attend - this month that will include Marcus Druitt and Rosemary MacGregor.
