

CELEBRATING FATHER'S DAY

I'm really thankful that our throw-away culture hasn't ditched the concept of celebrating Father's Day. It's entirely appropriate that we pause to honour our dads, celebrate fatherhood, and acknowledge the important role fathers are meant to play.

As a father of kids that are still quite small, I adore the early morning bedroom invasion, the illegible handwritten cards, the barely edible attempt at "cooking" breakfast, and the ad-hoc lounge room performances that demand an audience. I never imagined that I'd love this stuff, but I do – every bit! I love being a dad, and I'm thankful that my small people want me to know that they love me back. It's an immense privilege – and it's one I wasn't expecting to have.

I distinctly remember how it felt, sitting opposite a fertility specialist, hearing them break the news that it was highly unlikely we'd ever have biological children of our own. There's a weight that comes with that kind of news that drives even the least disciplined of us to their knees in prayer. Thankfully, God had mercy and answered the heart-felt prayers of a couple of desperate young adults (four times over - what a showoff!).

I'm conscious that our good God doesn't always answer these prayers in this way. It's left me acutely aware of how much of a privilege it is to be a father, and how blessed I am to have a heavenly father who exemplifies what it means to be a good, gracious dad. I'm conscious that some of us haven't had a good experience with our earthly dads. Some of them haven't been present - emotionally or physically. Some of them have left us wondering whether they love their work or their hobbies more than their kids. Some have been rough and unkind, instead of gentle and loving like they're supposed to be. And some of them have died much sooner than we expected. Those kinds of experiences can make Father's Day tough - a day that wouldn't be missed if our throw-away culture got its hands on it.

Whatever your own experience may be, there's something redeemable about Father's Day, especially for the Christian, because we have a heavenly father who is worth celebrating, and emulating.

Here's a few things to remember about our heavenly father this Father's Day:



1) He showed up.

We should celebrate our dads and acknowledge our debt to them. However, we should also remember that our earthly dads aren't perfect. Even with the best of intentions, they make mistakes, forget, or just can't manage to do everything. Our heavenly father isn't like that. He's never too busy, pre-occupied, or disinterested. Just like Colin Buchanan has taught so many of our kids: "God never says oops, never slips up, never makes any mistakes". And when we needed him the most, he didn't leave us hanging he showed up:


Now You see, at just the right time, when we were still powerless, Christ died for the "ungodly. Very rarely will anyone die for a 😤 righteous person, though for a good person someone might possibly dare to die. But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

2) He adopted us - willingly, and at great cost.

There are quite a few among us who know what it's like to be loved by an earthly dad who stepped-in and stepped-up to love us: step-fathers, foster-fathers, adoptive-fathers. It's a commendable thing when dads choose to be invested and involved in the lives of their kids - biological or otherwise - and we should celebrate it! In fact, it can be reflective of the selfless love that our heavenly father has shown us in Christ - he isn't just intimately involved in our lives, he has adopted us as his very own children (Ephesians 1:4-6), and did so at enormous personal cost (Isaiah 53:4-6).

3) He won't abandon us. Ever.

Sadly, some of us know what it feels like to have an earthly father who, for one reason or another, bailed on us. Some may have extricated themselves from our lives entirely, others may still be around, but put up barriers and remain emotionally distant. Our heavenly father makes many promises to his people in the Bible – one such promise is to never do that. He's promised to never forsake us:



Be strong and courageous. Do not be afraid or terrified because of them, for the Lord your God goes with you; he will never leave you nor forsake you.

It's an Old Testament promise to ancient Israel (Deuteronomy 31:6) that is re-affirmed to us as Christians this side of the cross (Hebrews 13:5). And, in Christ, we have every reason to trust that our heavenly father will keep his word. Our saviour and brother, Jesus, has promised that he won't bail on us either (Matthew 28:20).

So, whether our earthly dads are still with us, or have departed, whether they were doting, or difficult, as Christians, there's much to celebrate this Father's Day - let's give thanks for our earthly dads, and praise God that he's our perfect heavenly father.

MEET A MEMBER

PAUL & LAUREN WHITE

Tell us how long you have been at St Faith's, ways you serve around church and what service you are a part of?

We joined in March this year, attend Saturday Church and love helping out any way we can, but particularly with food which comes quite naturally for our family.

How and when did you both start following lesus?

Lauren: I remember first experiencing faith in Primary School scripture, and then in early High School I was invited to youth group (pool party!) and a while later hearing teaching in church it became clear that being a Christian was to simply follow Christ, and it became real for me. Paul: My mother was a nominal Christian when she got married, my father became a Christian because of the sermon on his wedding day. I came along soon after, and my faith grew up with theirs. My love of Jesus was nurtured by wonderful youth ministry at St David's Forestville, my faith becoming most vibrant and alive during our annual youth camps, and later through preaching at various KCC events (so proud that Lauren now serves on the KCC board - Lauren. don't delete this bit in your final edit!).



Why is it important for you to be a part of a church family?

Spiritually we are one in Christ, and we are family, so we want to live it out together, loving, serving and encouraging each other. We also love seeing our kids form friendships, grow in their faith and have such a great time at St Faiths – we feel incredibly blessed to be a part of the St Faith's family.

What have been the main things you have learnt from 1 Corinthians so far?

Lauren: To think more about how God sees us than others. Paul: I've been shaken a little by the damage pride in performance can cause in a church community. And the sharp corrective Paul so urgently delivers to a gathering of new believers. I've been wondering what type of letter Paul might write to me, who's walked with the Lord for most of my life, or to an established church like St Faiths.

Which I always am.


