# MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR



Welcome

Dear Church,

Welcome along to St Faith's if you're visiting us for the summer, looking for a new church home, or you're here every week as part of our church family. Happy New Year to you all! A new year for most people comes with new goals, new targets, and maybe even a few new year's resolutions, but our vision and goal here at St Faith's, under God, remains the same....

We want to see a Northern Beaches that knows Jesus by making disciples who grow to maturity in Christ for God's glory.

To that end, knowing that God matures us through his word and by his Spirit, we've got an awesome year of bible teaching planned along with other events that we pray will help us grow to maturity in Christ together. I thought it'd be helpful to give you a bit of a snapshot of where we're heading for the year with regards to our teaching plan:

#### **Teaching Series 2023**

#### Term 1 (February to April) | John's Gospel – chapters 13-21

In 2021 we studied the first part (John 1-5) of the first half of John's Gospel, which is often referred to as 'The Book

of Signs' (John 1-12). We began to see the public ministry of Jesus as he performed many signs that pointed to his true identity as God's promised Messiah, yet people still failed to recognise him. In 2022, we continued that journey through John's Gospel as Jesus wrapped up his public ministry, meeting those along the way who came to believe in Jesus and we saw the increasing agitation of the Jewish leaders plotting to kill him. In 2023 we will finish our journey in John's Gospel, turning our attention to 'The Book of Glory' (John 13-21) where Jesus prepares his disciples for what is to come - his trial, his death, his resurrection and the coming of the Holy Spirit.

## Term 2 (May to July) | The Book of Exodus – Part II

In 2021 our Old Testament focus was on the book of Genesis which finished with Joseph, his brothers, and the rest of the Israelite's bunkering down in Egypt, escaping the famine, yet living with the hope of the land and blessing that God had promised to Abraham, Isaac, and Jacob. In 2022, we continued to follow the journey of the God's people through the book of Exodus which demonstrated God's deliverance of his people from

slavery in Egypt. This year, we'll pick up Exodus where we left off, with God's people wandering in the desert and finally being led to the edge of the Promised Land. The book of Exodus will again remind us that God is a personal God who speaks, who lives among his people, who controls all of history, who is holy, who remembers his promises, and who acts in judgment to bring salvation to his chosen people.

#### July Mini-Series | PRAYER

Prayer is so central to the Christian faith and a spiritual discipline which can grow our intimacy and dependence on God and yet most of us struggle to consistently pray. In this short series, we'll consider what the Bible teaches about prayer, what it looks like to make prayer a part of our daily lives with God, and help us to be a people who are prayerfully dependent on God.

#### Term 3 (July to September) | 1 Corinthians

In 2022, we looked at the first 10 chapters of 1 Corinthians as Paul sought to address divisions within the church so that God's people would be strengthened and their witness to the world around them effective. As we look at the second half of this letter in 2023, we'll see how relevant it is for our context today as Paul seeks to address the relationship between Christians and their surrounding pagan culture, divisions within the church itself, good order in church and the use of spiritual gifts, along with matters of personal morality such as sex, marriage, and celibacy.

## October Mini-Series | THE APOSTLE'S CREED

We declare it together in song and liturgy, but what biblical truths are we declaring when we say the Apostle's Creed together? This three-week mini-series will help us to unpack some of the theological significance of this creed, which has been passed down through generations for us today.

#### Term 4 (October to December) | Commitment Series + Advent

Finally in term four, as has become our usual practice, we will spend a month in our Commitment Series (what it is we're committed to and why) and a month of Advent leading up to our Christmas services and celebrations, along with a visit from Compassion.


I'm really excited for what God, through his word and by his Spirit, will be teaching us in the year ahead and I pray that it is both enriching, challenging, corrective, equipping and comforting (2 Tim 3:16) for us all as we continue to strive to please God in living lives that are obedient to his word.

### KATIE & GEOFF LANCASTER

## Tell us how long you have been at St Faith's and what service you are a part of?

We've been going to St Faith's for over 2 years at the Sunday 6pm service. We also are part of a small group with the Everingham's, Elkan's, Foote's and Jacobs'.

### How and when did you both start following Jesus?

Katie – I have had a faith my whole life but when I was 14 I decided that it was really important to me. I guess I knew that I had to make a decision on my own and not just follow what my family believed.

Geoff - I grew up going to Sunday School but my family wouldn't call themselves Christians. I think my parents thought it was a good thing to do and it also gave them a chance to sleep in on a Sunday. I made some friends through CEBS and then started going to a youth group at St Aidan's Longueville when I was in Year 7. I struggled with the concept that I was making a choice that was different to my parents but felt convicted that I needed to make a commitment to follow Jesus. I was mentored by some great Christian youth leaders when I was in High School, which is probably part of the reason I became a High School teacher - knowing what a critical time it is for the development of faith.

## Why is it important for you to be a part of a church family?

Katie – Church family has so many benefits, we meet friends at church, we share our joys and struggles with each other and pray with and for each other. I love that as a group we spend time reflecting on our lives and trying to be more like Jesus. Sharing a love of God is a huge bonding point and it means that I can be myself and know that I am accepted even when I am new to the community. Having a church family has been super important for our three daughters who have grown up in church communities with incredible people who have encouraged them in their faith.

Church reminds us that we are part of an incredible story and that we aren't the centre of that story but we have a role to play wherever God has put us. If we don't meet together then we get distracted, more worldly and self absorbed. Being part of a Church makes us feel part of the community and it is a place to build relationships that support us in our faith and where we can support others as well. The teaching also keeps us on track and encourages us through all the seasons of life.

## What have been the main things you have been challenged/encouraged by in the Advent teaching series?

Katie - I really like the focus on Jesus coming the first time and the importance of being ready for the second coming. Preparing our hearts for Christmas also softens our hearts to God and makes us more receptive to the Holy Spirit in our lives.

Geoff - We've been challenged not to be complacent about Christmas. Even though Christmas looks different with grown up children and family members who can't be around on the day, we need to stay focused on the birth of Jesus and be grateful for all God has done in our lives. I've also been challenged to speak more openly with my parents and to continue to pray the Holy Spirit would help them to understand the gift of Jesus this Christmas.

### CHRISTMAS LUNCH 2022



It was good to be back together again for a Christmas lunch after an enforced break. Nearly 100 people came on 2 December for this event (which I can't call a Seniors' Lunch, despite the fact that some of our members who are well and truly old enough to accept a government senior's card don't consider themselves seniors!) He encouraged us that Christianity is not so much a list of beliefs, but a person – the person of the Lord Jesus Christ, about whom he spoke clearly and movingly.

He had three headings: 'Persuasion, Sense and Sensibility, and Pride and Prejudice.' The allusion was not lost on the (mainly) senior audience! His talk combined clear biblical teaching, personal examples and quite a bit of humour. So many found it challenging and helpful.

The lunch was delicious, thanks to the wonderful catering of Christina Wood and her merry band of helpers, for which we are very grateful. All in all, it was a terrific time of fellowship and encouragement together.
