MESSAGE FROM OUR SENIOR PASTOR

Dear Church,

Recently in the news I've been reading about a 'revival' that has begun at Asbury University in Kentucky, USA. Following a regular, compulsory, chapel service in the auditorium, several students remained and began to share more deeply, confessing sin, repenting, and turning their hearts back to God. News of this spread through local news agencies and social media outlets and what followed was 12 days of 'revival' as people arrived from outside the university to see and experience this 'spiritual awakening'.

Now I imagine that some might be a little sceptical about what was taking place, while others may see this as God's Spirit beginning a phenomenal and supernatural work in the hearts of young people as they

turn and surrender their lives to Jesus. Whatever you believe, it's a wonderful reminder that God is in the business of transforming people's lives. Through his word and by his Spirit, he calls us to turn from the sin that so easily entangles our lives, to throw it off, and to trust in Jesus' work on the cross in dealing with the consequences of our sin and the judgement we rightly deserve. Of course, we're familiar with this message of the gospel, aren't we? But have we grown apathetic towards it? Have our hearts grown hard to God's Spirit as he convicts us of sin and points us to Jesus? When was the last time you came before God in heartfelt repentance recognising that you've failed to love God with your whole heart, soul, mind and strength? When was the last time you confessed your sin to God, or to a brother or sister in Christ, and asked for God's forgiveness?

As we approach the Easter season and specifically remember Jesus' greatest act of love in laying down his life, in obedience to his Father's will and for his glory - it's worth stopping and considering the 'revival' that God needs to begin in you.

Here at St Faith's, we want to see a Northern Beaches that knows Jesus - that is, we want to see God's Spirit convict people's hearts so that they recognise their sin and turn to Jesus as their Saviour. We want to see more and more disciples who demonstrate maturity by obeying God's word, in response to God's Spirit moving in their hearts and transforming their lives.

Do you think God can do that?

Do you think God can revive the hearts of our neighbours and friends on the Northern Beaches?

Do you think he will?

Maybe it starts with me.....

Heavenly Father - fill our lives with the fruit of your Spirit, enable us to walk in joyful obedience to your commands, and sharing your love by word and deed we pray that you might be glorified in us to see a Northern Beaches that knows Jesus. Amen.

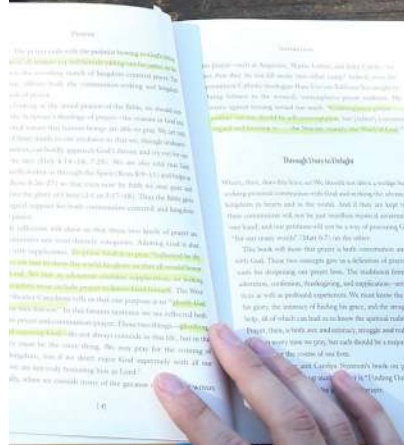

We are thankful to God for providing Phil to take on this role. From Term 2 Rachel Purcell will be working for Cromer Campus as a Department employee in both PE and as a Learning and Support Teacher. It is anticipated that this will include being a Support Teacher in Scripture classes, praise God. Phil is actually Rachel's step-father, and under God they will make a fabulous team at Cromer, with Phil being able to learn from Rachel and benefit from the great relationships that she has formed over the years. In 2023 we are rebooting a Christian lunchtime group after COVID, and having Phil as a long-term member of the church that is so near Cromer Campus will help to build relationships between Youth Groups and Pastors in the area and Christian teenagers at Cromer.

As you may be aware, there is currently a serious teacher shortage across the country, and the Northern Beaches is not exempt. It's not just media hype - ask anyone who works at a school about how hard it has been to find enough staff for 2023, especially in Secondary Schools! As a result, the Board has needed to step outside of its usual practice of appointing someone who has Teaching qualifications. We wanted to assure our Supporters that this decision has been taken prayerfully and that the Board are united in believing that we are following the Lord's will in this. I'm reminded of the young David from 1 Samuel - he was not the one Samuel was expecting to anoint, but "the LORD looks at the heart" (1 Sam 16:7) and we have found in Phil "a man after [the LORD's] own heart" (1 Sam 13:14). VOLUNTEERING AT THE WAR VETS

Hi Everyone,

It thrills me to write about the wonderful Christian work ongoing at the War Veteran Villages, Narrabeen (War Vets). The Villages, of course, hold Sunday Services in their chapel but you may not be aware that there are further events happening throughout the working week. These events can comprise of a Church Service in a particular Nursing Home or in a Assisted Living Hostel. Some events are simply a one-on-one pastoral care visit.

The War Vets have their chaplains, of course, such as Tony Bradford and Bob Durban (Uniting Church) who do a wonderful and tireless job in providing Christian love to all they come in contact with. And they have many resident helpers as well. But, with all that, if it wasn't for volunteers with a Christian faith based background, many important activities would have to be curtailed. To be unable to reach out with the loving message of Christ would, off course, be a terrible travesty.

I have been volunteering at the War Vets for many years but before I explain some of my activities and those of other Christian volunteers that I share them with I would like to highlight why the Christian message and Christian fellowship is so important, which as a Christian is obvious, but in many ways why it is of unique importance for these particular people.

The folk at the War Vets are, of course primarily in the senior years of their life. They're all at various stages of mobility and cognitive ability. Those that have major problems in these areas do not have spontaneous access to a Church environment as you and I do. Many in their earlier lives have been regular Church attenders and carry a strong Christian faith. How sad would

that be if they were having to accept that a Church for them would be no more. Another factor to consider is that many have lost their life's partner and don't regularly have family members in attendance to help fill that void. Finally and possibly the most important factor is that many have not lead Christian lives but when they are met with the realisation of their approaching mortality we are there to show them the amazing offer of immortality through our Lord Jesus.

Just like quite a few of the others I am, as I say, a long term volunteer. Over that time I have primarily helped with weekday hostel Services. I have done some one-on-one visits and they certainly can be challenging and I greatly admire the wonderful people that continue to do so such as our Kath McLaren. I'm currently in a team providing a Church Service on Thursday afternoons at a hostel called 'Kokoda'. We have Tony Bradford preaching, Nerilyn Schooley (St Faiths) piano and Bible readings, June Lewis (Warringah Christian Church) Prayers and Devotions, and myself as Service leader. Other than piano, all those roles can on some occasions be rotated. It is, of course, a joy for all of us to be part of the team and serving our Lord as well. We have great fun and a great and loving interaction with the residents and nearly always receive a passionate thank you for being there.

I have to say that more Christian volunteers are always needed. If you were to volunteer the joy you would receive and the joy that you give the residents would be most rewarding. You would meet some wonderful and endearing characters. You would make loving friendships and you would hear some amazing stories of strong and enduring Christian lives.

In closing I thank our Lord for all Christian volunteers. I also thank Him for the opportunity to bring this message to everyone's notice. With a prophetic state of mind, it is interesting to note that we of mobility and clear of mind always have the choice to seek to have the Word of God explained to us and edified within us whilst in the company of a Christian fellowship. Many of those I've spoken of do not have that choice.

MAKING SENSE OF 'GOOD' FRIDAY

Each year in the lead-up to Easter, I inevitably find myself in conversation about why we call Good Friday, 'Good Friday'.

It isn't a bad question, is it? Especially considering that the day we'll soon mark involves the abuse, torture and brutal execution of our Lord, Jesus. 'Black Friday' sounds like a more appropriate title (although I understand that one's already taken) - so perhaps 'Bad Friday' or 'Sad Friday' might be more appropriate. And yet, wherever you go in the world, you'll soon find Christians gatherings to mark 'Good Friday'. Which begs the question: how can we celebrate the execution of our Lord as a good day?

I believe the Bible's answer is the penal substitutionary nature of Christ's work on the cross.

Penal substitutionary atonement is the notion that Christ's death paid a penalty ('penal'). This penalty was due to fall on us all, and yet it fell on Christ ('substitutionary'). The outcome of Christ's work is divine forgiveness for us ('atonement').

Although the language of penal substitutionary atonement might be unfamiliar or sound a little too technical for your liking, it portrays something profoundly simple and, hopefully, very familiar for the Christian: Christ died in our place, for our sins,

that we might be forgiven by God. That notion sits at the heart of the Christian gospel and is one that affords tremendous comfort for those in Christ, and yet, depending on your background, it can be something that sits very uncomfortably with others. It's not uncommon to hear penal substitution described as a form of cosmic child abuse - a doctrine that reduces God to an angry deity, requiring a sacrifice to satisfy his wrath.

The key problem behind this view is a failure to put the issue in a framework of justice. Justice we get. Justice we cry out for. Injustice makes us rightly angry. We are satisfied when justice is met, we are angry when someone 'gets away with it'. And yet all of us (not just others) are guilty of crimes against God and against others. We have all rebelled against Him, committed treason against our King, rejected our Heavenly Father, broken God's divine laws, and hurt each other time and time again.

Hence a dilemma for God - his creatures, that he lovingly crafted to be in an intimate relationship - are guilty. So what should God do? Just 'forgive' and forget? Where is the justice in

that? Or, should he bring down the gavel, declare us all guilty and punish us appropriately? This would be just and justified, but it would mean that no one would then be able to experience eternal life with our Heavenly Father that we were created for.

The solution? Penal Substitutionary Atonement. God Himself comes to earth in the person of Jesus, to die in our place, for our sins, that we might be forgiven by God.

An alternative way to think about this is with the concept of debt. Imagine you're in a minor car accident and your car is written off. It's entirely their fault, and it turns out they're not insured. If you choose to have mercy and forgive them, your car doesn't magically get fixed. Someone has to pay - you!

When God chooses to forgive us, there's still a debt to pay, and we can't pay it. God chooses to have mercy on us, and pay the debt Himself.

Praise be to our God, who has had mercy on us, took on flesh, took our place, and died for our sins, to pay the debt that we could not pay ourselves. Just like the cartoon, that's why it's Good Friday!
