COMPASSION FIELD TRIPS

In November, I had the privilege and joy of being involved in a field trip experience with Compassion for church leaders and pastors. This was the first trip Compassion held since the pandemic and it was an amazing experience!

I joined a team of 14 people from all over Australia and New Zealand to see, first-hand, the amazing work that Compassion is involved with in the Philippines. We spent our first three days in Manila, visiting local partner churches and meeting children, and whole families, whose lives have been transformed by the gospel through their involvement with the program at their local church. This opportunity is only possible because of the financial sponsorship of donors all over the world. We visited the Compassion head office and met staff who advocate for children in poverty on a daily basis, all for the glory of God and the cause of Christ's mission in the world. The gospel heart of every Compassion worker and church partnership was evident everywhere we went and was obviously the motivation for their work and advocacy. After Manila we flew to Tacloban City (about an hour's flight south-east of Manila), where we jumped on a bus for three and half hours to a remote town called Biliran. From there, each day we drove deeper into some of the most remote villages in the Philippines where we were welcomed by members of local churches, along with their Compassion program children and the joy of the Lord! Some of these partner churches have never had overseas visitors and so we were able to sing, learn, and pray together, hearing of God's goodness demonstrated to them through their local church's partnership with Compassion! From the very practical needs of food and medical supplies, to the importance of belonging in Christian community, youth and children's programs, discipleship groups and much more – God is at work growing his church, in number and maturity, through the ministry of local churches in partnership with Compassion. And it's our humble sponsorship that enables this fruitful ministry to happen!

One of the greatest moments of this trip was the joy of meeting the Molyneux family's newest Compassion sponsor child, Dexter. It's hard to express or put into words the joy of that moment and the overwhelming joy of meeting his grandparents who expressed with clarity the difference our sponsorship will make, not just to Dexter, but to his whole family.

I look forward to sharing more with you in church on Sunday 3rd December. We will dedicate that Sunday to the work of Compassion, hearing also from our Compassion Rep, Paul Beeston. We will have an opportunity to sponsor Compassion children, with a particular focus on one area of the Philippines called the City of Iriga. St Faith's members already sponsor over 100 children in this region, and we hope to continue to build that – and maybe in the future, head over to meet some of them!

FRI 8	Thank God for the opportunity to share a CHRISTMAS LUNCH celebration here at church today. Give thanks for the team of volunteers who have helped coordinate this event. Pray many will come along and share lunch. Pray for Ben as he speaks about his trip last month to the Philippines with Compassion.

SAT 9	ST FAITH'S KIDS – Give thanks for the faithful service of our children's leaders over the past year and for Lyndal Foote who oversees the children's ministry each week here at St Faith's. Pray as the holiday period approaches that the leaders will have a restful break and they will return refreshed in the new year and continue to teach the children faithfully and lovingly.
