MESSAGE FROM OUR Senior Pastor

Dear Church,

Each month, on the second Monday evening of the month, a small group of faithful saints gather at church to pray. There's no preparation involved. There's no huge commitment required. Just a heart and enthusiasm to come before humbly in prayer. Each month we publish our monthly prayer diary (now also available on the PrayerMate app for those who like tech!) and more recently our Chillout Prayer Team handout in the lead up to our week of mission in July. But do we really believe in the power of prayer? Do we really have confidence that our prayers even make a difference? Or that God does anything with them?

This week I read, "The agony and ecstasy of the church prayer meeting" (Australian Church Record, Easter 2024) by Simon Manchester. I found that his comments challenged my own views of 'confidence' in God when it comes to prayer. He says.... "Confidence of course it is not our emotion or language or godliness - or even our desperation - that forces God's interest in our prayers. The scripture wonderfully tells us that "His ear is ever open to our cry" and that we should "cast our cares because He cares" for us. It's because of who He is and because of who we are that prayers arrive in His ear. He has committed Himself to our prayers.

There have been times when I've been talking with a young mum at church - and the things I've been saying to her have been of course fascinating and riveting stuff - but she turns away from my blabber because she has heard the cry of her child. It's always a reminder to me that the cry of the believer is deeply, deeply interesting to God - more than we or anyone else may think. This confidence in God's interest in our prayers needs to be recaptured. Too many believers have little or no confidence that their prayer is really doing anything and simply go through the motions because it's the thing to do. The idea that words spoken to God would be heard, heeded, taken seriously and would 'move the machinery of heaven' has almost disappeared from view. But the work of Jesus has secured our adoption and our adoption means access to the throne of a Heavenly Father and at the throne of our Heavenly Father, He takes our words seriously. We may not take them seriously, but He does.

So, I hold these two ideas of desperation and confidence together - that we should know and feel and express our desperation and that He is worthy of our confidence as the Father who actually listens and responds perfectly." What are you desperately expressing to God in prayer right now? Maybe it's the personal health afflictions you have, or those around you suffer from; maybe it's the concern of increasing violence in our community; maybe it's the salvation of the souls of family and friends who don't yet trust in Jesus? Whatever it is - know with great certainty that God is worthy of your confidence as our Father who listens and responds perfectly to our desperate cries. How good is that?!

Our prayer meeting is on Monday 10th June, 7pm at church. Everyone is welcome.

PARISH COUNCIL And the

Our new Parish Council has met twice since our AGM in March covering a range of different topics, questions from our AGM, and the general oversight of church, church property and finances.

The major talking points and decisions:

- Bibles for Church: Parish Council has recently approved the purchase of a new set of church bibles which will be rolled out in the coming months. This will put the Bible back in the hands of our church members during church, which was taken away during Covid.

- Nungalinya Bible College Support: we also recently accepted a proposal from a congregation member to include the Nungalinya Bible College in the Northern Territory as one of our mission partners. This links nicely with our partnership with the Webb's in Broome and our desire to support mission in our country to Indigenous communities. - Accessible Parking: our Wardens have been considering a number of short term options for making the accessible parking at church more accessible for those in need of these car spots. Changes to the carpark will be made in the coming months to clearly mark two accessible spots, along with the repainting of carpark lines.

- St Faith's Master Plan Team: Parish Council has also recently endorsed a "Master Plan Committee" made up of various congregation members with particular skills and experience to help us consider the long term plans for our resources / buildings here at St Faith's. This committee will look to prepare something for St Faith's congregations by the end of 2024.
