

Staff Update

For this Community Mag, unfortunately I don't have an update regarding our vacant Associate Pastor position, though I can tell you that things are progressing well. Please continue to pray that God would give wisdom and discernment as I seek to make an appointment in this regard. I hope to have some sort of announcement in the coming month, however, I don't expect our new Pastor will be able to start until early 2025. With this, and Marcus Druitt taking some long service leave in November / December, I have invited Rev. Dr Matt Baines (4pm) to join our staff team to assist us while Marcus is on leave. I'm thankful for Matt's enthusiasm at church in general, but especially his leadership of our PTC group this year, and I'm glad he accepted my invitation onto the team temporarily. Matt will officially come on board (three days per week) on 28 October, when Marcus vanishes for a couple of months!

Synod

Spring also means that the Sydney Anglican Synod is on the horizon. For those who aren't familiar with the Anglican Synod, it is two weeks formal meetings where representatives from each Sydney Anglican Church, along with other Diocesan organisations (like Anglican Schools, Anglicare etc) gather to discuss and make decisions on matters of doctrine, governance, and other significant issues affecting the church.

Some of the 'hot topics' for consideration at Synod include a report on attendance patterns in Sydney Anglican churches, religious freedom, professional development for ministry workers, and a focus on the development of Diocesan Property Strategy. Ross Jones (10am), who currently serves as the CEO of Sydney Anglican Property will be involved in various items, and your representatives at Synod (voted in by you at the AGM) are Bob Pryor (10am), Cath McAdam (10am), along with myself as the Rector of the Parish. We would all value your prayers as we contribute to the wider mission of the diocese in this way.

Synod is being held on 16–18 & 23–24 September. For those who are interested, Synod papers are public documents – you can find them at **www.sds.asn.au/synod**.

Watoto Children's Choir

I'd love you to set aside an hour or so on Saturday 14th September for a special performance by the Watoto Children's Choir, which will start at 2pm at St Faith's. Watoto Children's Choirs have travelled extensively since 1984 sharing a message of hopenot only for Africa's most vulnerable children and women-but for people all over the world! And we're stoked they're coming here to Narrabeen to perform songs off their brand-new album, "Better Days—There Is Hope." This would be a great event to invite friends and family members along to - it's free, though there will be an opportunity to support the work of Watoto and purchase Watoto merchandise.

What Do We Do?

At Gumtrees Playtime, we aim to create a warm and welcoming environment where parents, grandparents, carers, and children can connect, play, and spend quality time together. Our program begins with nearly an hour of free play, followed by a prayer, morning tea, a story, singing, musical activities, and craft sessions.

Since 80% of our attendees are not Christians, we strive to gently incorporate a Christian perspective into our music, stories, and conversations. Our goal is to share our faith in a way that feels natural and non-intrusive, ensuring that everyone feels safe and welcomed in our church environment. We also announce the 'Discover' course during relevant weeks, offering those interested an opportunity to explore Christianity further. Through these efforts, we aim to foster a community where everyone who comes to Gumtrees can come to know and love the Lord, working towards the vision of St Faiths to see a Northern Beaches that knows Jesus!

Encouragements and Joys

One of our greatest sources of encouragement is the dedicated team of women who volunteer each week. Their crucial roles in setup, organisation, and prayer, along with their meaningful conversations with attendees, have significantly built trust with the parents. Parish Council SEPTEMBER UPDATE

The Parish Council has met each month throughout the year and has had regular updates from Ben Molyneux and the ministry team members he invites along to the meetings. This provides the Parish Council with a helpful overview of how the ministry is running overall.

You may have noticed that there has been plenty of maintenance work happening in and around church over the last few months. We are thankful for Alan Madder (10am) and his contributions, along with David Lawson (6:30pm) who is giving around eight hours a week in maintenance work around the church. The general maintenance has included rust, rails, carpark lines, painting, repairing holes in walls, replacing rusted fencing, globes for lights, and much more. Some of the larger jobs have been managed by Alan Madder with his building experience, including a new roof over the entrance to church which was completely rusted out, new air conditioning units, and the flattening of the rear driveway. A massive thanks to Alan and David for all their hard work.

About 18 months ago, a request was made to the Parish Council to have a memorial plaque installed in the gardens of the staff houses in Acacia Street in Collaroy Plateau. The Parish Council agreed that this was a helpful way for people to remember the original use of that space by St Andrew's Anglican Church, Collaroy Plateau. It took a long time to install because of various approvals at a Diocesan level, but we're happy to let you know that this is now complete! See the pictures below.



Our Master Plan Committee, commissioned by the Parish Council earlier this year, met for a full day of planning, praying and dreaming about the future of our church and the use of our resources in July. This was a useful time, recognising the great assets of our church, and thinking through how we continue to use them for God's glory and the growth of his church. The Master Plan Committee will report back to the Parish Council in the coming months regarding their findings and 'blue sky' thinking.

Finally, please keep praying for SRE teachers! In our July meeting we were

presented with a helpful paper from Peggy King, who oversees our SRE program at St Faith's. The need for SRE teachers is critical and the Parish Council affirmed their support of this wonderful outreach, even offering potential teachers financial support with the cost of accreditation. If you are interested in teaching SRE in 2025, we would love to hear from you and so would Peggy. Please don't delay!

INTRODUCING Michele Smith

Part-Time Chaplain at the War Vets

1. Tell us a bit about you and your family.

I grew up in a Lutheran Christian home. My parents were Dutch immigrants. I grew up in Blacktown, and then lived in Hong Kong, until returning to work and study. My husband is Simon, a Cabinetmaker, and we have been married for 25 years. We have two adult daughters, Saffron and Sierra.

2. When and how did you come to know Jesus and put your trust in him?

After University I drifted from attending church. One afternoon, I was approached by an evangelist while on a bus whose questions forced me to take stock of my relationship with Jesus. I was confronted by my lack of true understanding of who Jesus is and any evidence of trust in Him. By grace, I was convicted and utterly devastated at this realisation. I began attending church again and have grown in faith ever since.

3. Where do you church with your family? What's one thing you love about your church?

My family and I attend church at Narrabeen Baptist Church. NBC is a source of encouragement and support to our spiritual growth through its biblical teaching, and opportunities to serve and share faith experiences.

4. You've recently taken on a two-day Chaplaincy role at the War Vets. Tell us about your days at the War Vets - what do you do, how do you seek to encourage people in the gospel, and how are you encouraged by the work you're involved in?

The War Vets is a retirement village comprised of multiple nursing homes and independent living villages. It is a community of mainly elderly residents and some younger war veterans affected by active military service. I work under the direction of the resident Chaplain, Rev. Tony Bradford.

I have the privilege of serving in two nursing homes. In Peter Cosgrove House, together with the help of two volunteers, we deliver a Chapel service each Tuesday morning. The other nursing home is Kokoda where typically, I will visit residents and spend time with those who are lonely and need someone to listen to their story. I spend time with those who cannot communicate, I help feed residents Working with such a variety of people provides God with a constant source of teaching and encouragement for a fledgling Chaplain.



their lunch. I give attention to those with dementia and listen to what they say (even if it doesn't make any sense). Occasionally, I have the opportunity to take residents to the Dugout Café for a coffee or for a stroll in the gardens. Usually, I will gently question a resident about their spiritual belief, encourage them in their faith, and remind them of the gospel. Often, I will offer to pray for or with those who need prayer.

On Wednesday mornings I will be found helping the people who deliver a food pantry service called 'One Meal' and chatting to those who gather to benefit from that service.

I am gradually setting up a Bible study for female war veterans who are interested in exploring the Christian faith.

Working with such a variety of people provides God with a constant source of teaching and encouragement for a fledgling Chaplain. Regularly visiting residents, and sharing my faith and life with them, offers an invaluable insight into God's work in the lives of people who may have spent most of their years without Him, but now perceive and receive His grace like never before.

5. How can we pray for you in the coming months?

Please pray for:

- Wisdom and clarity in my day-to-day.
- Help in nurturing relationships with busy nursing staff.
- Courage when situations arise where I am still unfamiliar.
- A spirit of receptivity and spiritual curiosity for the people God puts in my path.
- Please continue to pray for the WarVets, its Management, the Chaplains Tony Bradford and Keith Walker, the volunteers and for the raising up of many more volunteers.

Give thanks for Bec as the new director, that she leads well and that the educators work well as a team. Pray for Lyndal and Marcus as they teach the children about Jesus. Pray the children will learn to love Jesus and follow him. Pray for opportunities to engage with families and educators about Christ.

THU 5	Pray for all the children at LIGHTHOUSE to continue their journey in their faith, to run the Christian race for the rest of their lives. Pray that as we look at our series in 'running for gold', the children can come to an understanding of the importance of the prize that has been set for us who believe and love the Lord Jesus. Pray for Molly who will be finishing up at the end of the term at Lighthouse to do her teaching pracs. Pray she is well prepared and for a blessing over her time finishing her uni degree. Pray for our Lighthouse leaders, Laurie, Maisy and Lizzy as they prepare for the HSC. Thank God that they have served faithfully and joyfully throughout the year despite the pressures of Year 12.
FRI 6	SOULIES - Ask that God would be working through the prayers of our young people as they pray for opportunities to invite friends to our Evangelistic Night on the last week of Term (20th September). Give thanks for Judith Baker and others who coordinate this group each week.
FRI 13	Pray for our SOULIES YEAR 12s (Lizzy Pienaar, Laurie Bronsveld, Maisy Jones, Paris Turner and Ryan Lawson) as we farewell them tonight, before they go into their HSC exams next term. Thank God for the work He has done in their lives and ask that He would continue it beyond their schooling years. Continue to pray that the church in Noonkanbah will be revived after the convention and will begin meeting regularly again.

FRI 27	As term 3 finishes, pray for safety for those who may be travelling during the two weeks break. Pray for students who are sitting their HSC EXAMS next month. Pray they will prepare well and ask God to sustain them and give them His peace and reassurance.

operation Christmas Child

It's that time again and our boxes are available for filling!

Operation Christmas Child is a part of Samaritan's Purse, a Christian International relief organisation who, throughout the year, assist in worldwide disasters. Our joy is being able to pack boxes for the children in the Pacific Islands and South East Asia to bless them at Christmas time, and give them the opportunity to hear about Jesus.

In 2023, 290,000 shoe boxes were collected in Australia and New Zealand and were distributed to Cambodia, Ukraine, Fiji, Papua New Guinea and a sensitive country which cannot be named. Each child is given a booklet in their own language called, "The Greatest Journey," which is the story of Jesus. Many children enrolled in this discipleship program made decisions to follow Christ - what a blessing! Praise God.

To participate, all you need to do is pick up and sign for your box and read the enclosed instructions carefully. Choose an age group and a boy or girl. You will find gift ideas and some information on what items not to include.



Please pray for the child who will receive your gift as you choose items and pack the box. The Quilting Club has provided some items for you. When your box is complete and labelled, return and tick it off. All boxes are due back by the 6th October. Last year we sent around 190 boxes – so let's get over 200 this year!

St Faith's has been involved for over 20 years and many of us buy items on special throughout the year anticipating the arrival of the boxes. Detailed information and videos are available online at: operationchristmaschild.org.au



New book alert!

It's possible some of you might know **Sarah Jones**, from our 10am service, she's been around the place for a while - 40 years to be exact (but who's counting?) - becoming a Christian through the youth group at St Faiths back in high school, when bubble skirts and Choose Life t-shirts reigned supreme. Sarah is married to Ross and is mum to Sam, Molly, Maisy and Toby.

Sarah has just released her first book, titled: 'DEMENTIA, WHO ARE YOU AND WHAT HAVE YOU DONE WITH MY MOTHER?', which is the personal and heartfelt story of living through her mother's dementia.



With our ageing population, nearly one million Australians will have some form of dementia by 2050. If people haven't yet had their lives touched by dementia, the chances are, they soon will.

We asked Sarah why she wrote this book? "We were totally unprepared when Mum was diagnosed with this horrible disease and felt alone and unsure of how it would all unfold. I wanted to write the kind of book I would have loved to have had access to when we were going through it."

"My hope and prayer is that this book will be relatable and offer comfort to those in a similar situation, with a loved one battling dementia, and give them assurance they are not alone".
