gone the next.

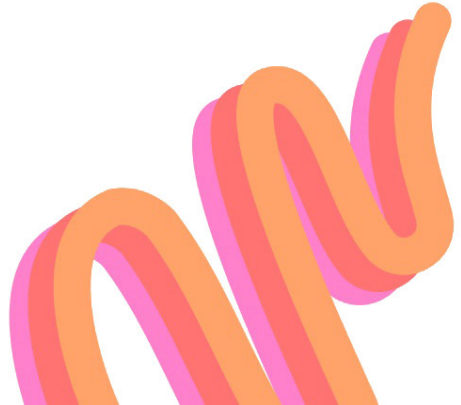
Is that type of JOY even possible?

MEET OUR NEW Associate Minister!

Tell us a bit about you and your family.

I'm Nic, married to Sophie, and we have two children, Lucia (Lulu, almost 3 y/o) and Arthur (8m). Sophie and I started dating in 2014 when I awkwardly asked her out for coffee. Through Sophie's patience, feedback and the kindness of God, I managed to gradually up my dating game, and we married in 2018.

Before pursuing ministry, I was a social worker, specialising in child protection and foster care. Sophie is a Clinical Psychologist who has a particular interest in adolescents and young adults. Our professional interests have given us much to discuss over the years! God has wired us to be interested in knowing people deeply and seeing them thrive. It brings us both immense joy.

Share with us a bit about how you came to know Jesus.

I possibly came to faith reading a bookmark. In Primary School Scripture (SRE), I was given a bookmark with Psalm 139:105 written on it: "Your word is a lamp unto my feet and a light unto my path." My family didn't attend church regularly (apart from the occasional Christmas service), but the bookmark persuaded me that knowing

God would lead me to light, truth and life. I took great care of it and re-read it at difficult times.

As a teenager, my brother Alex and I were invited to our local youth group, where the talks were compelling, the youth leaders loving, and my friends inclusive. If the bookmark motivated me to seek God, youth group finally showed me how to find Him. I was helped to access the Bible, understand its message and taught to live consistently by it. In the language of Boromir (Lord of the Rings), Jesus became "my brother, my Captain, my King." In a remarkable way, Alex put his trust in Jesus around the same time as me and he's still running with Jesus today.

You went off to Moore College in 2021. What did you enjoy most about studying theology?

Amongst the acquisition of biblical skills, I was given a deeper theological vision of Christ as the one through whom and for whom all things were made (Col 1:16) – the gospel is a message about Christ that sweeps up the rest of reality (including you and me!) into an amazing journey. I've had four years to begin to get a handle on that, and I'm so grateful.

I went to Moore College with the goal of deepening my convictions, out of which I might confidently and lovingly pastor people. Moore College certainly did that, but it also humbled me by showing me the need to pursue lifelong learning and the foolishness of thinking, "I've arrived."

What sort of things do you and your family like to do on the weekends or days off together?

We love to go outside - anywhere, nature especially, which has been tricky living in Newtown. Lulu is very interested in scootering, so much time is spent chasing her around. We also enjoy spending time with people - friends, family, church. Most days off are spent doing something with others. Soph and I like going out to see a show - theatre, a gig, an art gallery - when we can get some time away from the kids. We love eating great food. I love to go trail running, bush walking, reading, lifting heavy things and putting them back down again. Soph recently bought me a sketching book & pencils, which I've found enjoyable and relaxing. Soph is a bookworm and loves gardening and various forms of art-making.



You will be joining our staff team as an Associate Pastor in February. What are you most looking forward to about your new role at St Faith's?

One of the blessings of ministry is the fact that discipleship is never one way — the phrase 'one another' comes up over and over in the New Testament (John 13:34 "love one another"; Rom 1:12 "be mutually encouraged by each other's faith"; Rom 12:10 "Be devoted to one another in love. Honor one another above yourselves.") Ministry is reciprocal — a partnership — I'm excited to serve with you alongside Ben and the ministry team. My family and I are going to learn to love Jesus more. So I can't wait to meet you!

If Paul paraphrased his ministry, I reckon he might say something like, "I received as much as I gave. I don't regret the risks I took for Jesus. Not for a moment. Your growing love for Jesus is my reward. I'm owed nothing." (Phil 2:17) That's the kind of life I'm praying I might learn to live, and that's the kind of pastor I hope to be. Eyes lifted to Christ. Heart open to you. Please pray for us; we can't do this on our own strength. See you next year!

HSC Study Hall

At Soulies, we love our Year 12s! We're incredibly thankful to God for the way He has grown them in maturity and godliness and want to support them as best we can as they head towards the end of their schooling journey. With HSC exams just around the corner, our prayer is that while they study hard, they'll keep their eyes fixed on Jesus!

We want our Year 12s to be equipped to do both, so we're running **Study Hall from the 8th-11th of October.**

Along with 26 hours of quality study time during the week, we've got HSC teachers and tutors who'll be on deck, exam condition practice sessions, free barista coffee, morning tea, lunch and arvo tea, encouragements from the Bible each morning, and time each day to relax, hangout, and maybe even sneak in a swim at the beach. We're hoping that this will be a great time of academic and spiritual preparation for our students before exams kick off on the 15th of October.

STAFF UPDATE:

Rev. Matt Baines

As you are all aware by now, Marcus Druitt will be taking a well-earned break in November / December this year with some long service leave. Please be praying that this is a refreshing time for Marcus, Helen and their family.

However, this does leave us a little short on the staff team. In God's providence, Rev Matt Baines and his family rejoined us back at St Faith's at the end of the last year, and I asked Matt to help jump into the ministry team during Marcus' long service leave, to give us a bit of extra help in these busy months. Here's a bit about Matt and his family...

Tell us about you and your family.

I'm married to Larissa, and we have two daughters, Rachael (10) and Susanna (5). I used to work in chartered accounting before going to Moore College to train for ministry. After College I served as an Associate Minister at Minchinbury Anglican Church in the Western Suburbs of Sydney. Then we moved to Edinburgh so I could complete my master's and PhD in Systematic Theology. We've recently returned to Sydney from Edinburgh.

How did you come to know Jesus?

There isn't a time in my life when I didn't know Jesus Christ as my Lord and Saviour. But there are definitely moments in my life where I've been convicted of how great a sinner I am and how great a saviour Jesus is. One of the most significant moments was when I turned 18 and I was invited by my dad (a prison chaplain) to volunteer for prison ministry. That experience was helpful for reinforcing the fact that like the inmates I was ministering to, I am a sinner in need of grace. And I was really impacted by how I saw God working behind prison walls. I thought: "If God can change hearts and minds in here, then he can do anything." As a result of this experience, I felt called to full-time ministry.

You went off to Moore College. What did you enjoy most about studying theology?

I studied at Moore College for four years between 2011 and 2014. One of the most enjoyable things (and one of the most difficult things) is seeing how studying theology shapes your character. When we go to Bible College, we learn convictions and we develop competencies, but the most

important thing for Christian leaders to develop (as we've seen from our study of 1 Timothy) is Christian character.

And that's exciting, as you see how the Bible relates to all aspects of life. But it can also be a little bit confronting and scary, as we face the sharp edges and bumps that need to be refined and smoothed over by the gospel.

You've been teaching PTC at St Faith's this year. What are one or two things that have encouraged you leading this group?

I'm really encouraged that there are so many people who are so enthusiastic to know their Bible more thoroughly and their God more deeply. I'm really encouraged by the thoughtful, probing questions that I'm asked every week at PTC. I enjoy going away and digging deeper into the Bible and into the great Christian thinkers of the past and coming back the following week with further thoughts and reflections. I think I learn more from the group than they do from me. I'm really grateful that they give up an evening a week to spend with each other, and that I have the opportunity to learn so much from them.

You will be stepping in to assist the staff team while Marcus Drutt is away. What sorts of things will you be doing to assist?

My aim is to help work on the teaching materials for next year. I'm going to be writing Bible study booklets for Numbers, Matthew 8-12 and Ephesians. I'm also going to help prepare candidates for confirmation. I'll lead services. I'll preach. I'll also get to teach some Scripture classes. And whatever else might need doing! I'm really looking forward to working with the staff team and having more opportunities to get alongside everyone at church.



October PRAYER DIARY

TUE 1	ESL – Thank our almighty God for His blessings throughout Term 3, for the regular attendance of approximately 20 to 22 students and for the culture of learning in friendship. Give thanks that each year the Cottage are able to take on new interns as a way of helping put something back into the counselling profession; by giving the interns counselling experience to fulfill their course requirements, so they can then graduate and move into this wonderful world of professional counselling. As they start to invite applications for their internship program for 2025, pray they find the right person (or two) that will align well with the Cottage’s values and the faith-centred work culture.
FRI 4	Give thanks for the ten guests who attended DISCOVER , and for those who brought them. Give thanks for the fruitful conversations that were had and that all the guests want to continue in one way or another. Pray for Marcus as he leads at least four of those guests in a new DIGGING DEEPER group throughout October.
SAT 5	Pray for times of refreshment and rest during the SCHOOL HOLIDAYS – particularly for our families. Ask God to give wisdom to our parents in helping them make wise choices in how to use their time well and how to help themselves and their children rest well.
SUN 6	Pray for MARCUS PREACHING at all services at St Faith’s and for COLIN PREACHING at WAC. Pray we will clearly hear God’s message to flee from falsehood and pursue righteousness, godliness, faith, love, endurance and gentleness. Pray for those visiting to have open hearts.

MON 7	Thank God for JESUS CLUB , a ministry that shares the good news of Jesus to people with intellectual disabilities. Give thanks for our members Ben, Kathryn, Brendan, Dylan and others. As they meet on the first Monday of every month, pray they feel welcomed and cared for in a welcoming environment. Give thanks for our current leaders, Dan, Nat, Bec, Steve, Anne, Michael and Natalie, who dedicate much of their time to love and care for its members. Pray more people from the community will hear about Jesus Club and will want to come along and more volunteers to join the team.
TUE 8	Pray for all of our HSC STUDENTS WHO ARE ATTENDING OUR STUDY HALL AT ST FAITH'S over the coming four days. Pray that their time together is productive and helpful in both preparing them for exams, but also in Christian fellowship together. Give thanks for the teachers and youth leaders involved in running Study Hall.
WED 9	Pray for LYNDAL and ROSEMARY as they prepare talks to share with the women of St Faith's at INSPIRE from the book of Philippians. Give thanks for the time and hard work they have spent in looking carefully at the passages and ask God to use their bible talks to encourage the women that come along and hear them, and that the women of St Faith's would grow in their love for Jesus from what they hear.
THU 10	Pray for WARRIEWOOD BROOK as they will be holding its first ever Country Fair tomorrow. Pray it will be a wonderful event for the Warriewood Brook residents as well as those from nearby Anglicare Villages who will be attending. Give thanks for the St Faith's Quilting and Needlecraft group who will be holding a display and St Faith's and chaplaincy staff who will be in attendance to chat with residents and visitors. Give thanks for this opportunity and pray for positive conversations that point people to Jesus
FRI 11	THE VILLAGE CHURCH (TVC) in Jindabyne – Pray for the planning of our Children's Ministry program. Pray God raises up new leaders and helpers and renews the existing team with fervour to serve Him as they help the kids to know Jesus and make him known.
SAT 12	WAR VETS – Pray for Michele in her official role as part time Chaplain at the War Vets. Give thanks for her tireless work here as a volunteer for many years with our residents. This is a real answer to prayer. Pray for Homes for Heroes as they assist veterans in recovery from homelessness and that we continue to have opportunities to share the gospel and that more can do the Discovery Course at Faith's.

SUN 13	<p>Pray for PHILIP PREACHING at 8am and 10am church, COLIN PREACHING at 4pm and 6.30pm church and MARCUS PREACHING at WAC, starting on our new series in 2 Timothy. Ask for courage, support, wisdom and discernment as they seek assistance and for God to protect them in the midst of this. Pray for our staff team who are learning from the Anglicare team regarding domestic and family violence. Pray that this would be a useful time of equipping for our staff as we seek to love and support people in these circumstances inside and outside our church family.</p> <p>Pray also for our BELONG EVENING tonight at Ben and Yvette Molyneux's home. Pray for all of the new members of our church family who have joined us recently and pray that the opportunity to think about what it looks like to belong at St Faith's would be a useful time together. Pray that our newcomers would be warmly welcomed into church, relationships, community groups and serve teams.</p>

THU 17	QUILTING AND NEEDLEWORK CLUB – Give thanks for the new women who are coming along each week and new friendships being formed. Pray they feel welcomed. Praise God that these women can come together in fellowship and share skills, encourage each other and for the items they make for charity every year, such as Bear Cottage, Manly Youth and Adolescent Hospital, Samaritans Purse Christmas boxes, Anglicare and more recently sewing pouches for injured, rescued and sick animals. Give thanks for Judith who coordinates this group.
