MAKING THE MOST OF Christmas

For most of us, Christmas is a time of joy, reflection, and hope—a season that’s centered on celebrating the birth of Jesus. But amid the flurry of activity that might include end of school events, family Christmas parties, gift shopping, workplace functions, holiday preparations, planning for Christmas lunch – and much, much more – it’s so easy for us to lose sight of the true meaning of Christmas.

As a church family, we can use this season to embrace Christ’s love, deepen our faith, and shine His light into the world. So, here’s five ways that I think we can make the most of Christmas this year.

1. Embrace the Story of Christ’s Coming

Sounds obvious, right? But do we really embrace the story of Christ’s coming? Christmas is an awesome reminder of God’s plan to redeem the world through His Son, Jesus. How often do we stop and set aside time in the chaos to reflect on God’s word and immerse ourselves in the story of Christ’s birth?

If you haven’t already, why not consider incorporating Advent traditions into your personal or family life? On the kids table in the foyer of church, there’s some Advent calendars for the kids with Bible passages to use in the lead up to Christmas Day. But this isn’t just a kid’s thing! There’s plenty of Advent devotionals and ready-made Bible reading plans as well as awesome Spotify playlists with Christmas carols and hymns that draw your heart closer to God (I’ve made a few suggestions at the end of this article). By grounding ourselves in the Christmas story, we keep Jesus at the centre of our celebrations.

2. Cultivate a Spirit of Gratitude and Joy

Life’s challenges can often weigh heavily on our hearts, threatening to dim our joy in the Lord. For many among us, this season may feel particularly difficult, as trials and losses make Christmas a challenging time. Yet even in the midst of hardship, Christmas offers a powerful reminder to rejoice.

The angel's proclamation to the shepherds in Luke 2:10-11—"I bring you good news of great joy"—calls us to lift our eyes to God's enduring goodness. His gift of Jesus is a source of hope and joy that sustains us, even through life's darkest moments.

Gratitude shifts our perspective. I've been so encouraged that even in the middle of trial and affliction, God's people have still found reasons to cultivate gratitude and joy in their lives. When things slow down (or even if they don't), why don't you stop and make a list of the different ways that God has blessed you this year and thank Him for His faithfulness. Share this gratitude with others through cards, social media posts, or simple conversations. As you do, you'll find joy growing in your heart and spreading to those around you.

3. Give Generously and Serve Others

Christmas is a season of giving, reflecting the ultimate gift God gave us—His Son. Acts 20:35 reminds us, "It is more blessed to give than to receive." While it's natural to focus on giving within our families, this Christmas could also be an opportunity to extend that generosity outward, blessing others with your time, resources, and talents.

At church, you might consider participating in our Christmas services, helping with all that they entail, serving at the Christmas Lunch on 6 December,

or supporting ministries like Jesus Club and TCP. As families, you could make giving more personal—write letters to our missionaries or your Compassion sponsor child, bake treats for your neighbours, or even meet the needs of someone in financial hardship anonymously.

When we give at Christmas, we not only bless others but also reflect and magnify Christ's love and compassion for us, pointing hearts back to Him.

4. Build Christ-Centered Traditions

Traditions have a unique way of creating lasting memories that anchor us in love and gratitude. In my family, my Nana Moly's traditional Christmas pudding is the highlight of our Christmas dinner. Prepared in September and served at Christmas, it's doused in brandy and lit for dramatic effect—a true spectacle! Even though Nan was promoted to glory over ten years ago, this tradition remains a way to remember her, thank God for her, and celebrate the legacy she left. It's a powerful memory that keeps her close to our hearts.



Of course, not all traditions are quite so profound—The Grinch Who Stole Christmas makes an appearance every year in our family too! But whether silly or significant, traditions have a remarkable way of bringing us together and reminding us of what truly matters

As a family, what are some Christ-centered traditions you have—ones that create lasting memories and point people to Jesus? Perhaps you could start a tradition of reading the Christmas story from Luke 2 together each year. Setting up a nativity scene is another meaningful way to engage, as you discuss each person's role in the story and highlight that Jesus truly is the "star of Christmas." When our kids were younger, their Nana brought a birthday cake to our Christmas gathering so we could celebrate Jesus' birthday together. It was a simple yet powerful tradition that reminded us of the real reason for the season—Jesus being born into our world. Advent calendars with Bible verses are another wonderful tool for keeping the focus on Christ and His coming. Small traditions like these can have a big impact, anchoring our celebrations in the truth of the gospel.



When our traditions reflect Christ, they enrich the meaning of the season.

5. Share the Good News

Christmas is a powerful opportunity to share the gospel. I'm always moved, and often find myself emotional, during the singing of Christmas carols because it's the one time of the year when my wider family and friends sing about Jesus!

*Joy to the world, the
Lord has come, let
earth receive her King!*

What better time to pray for and step into meaningful gospel conversations! When the shepherds saw Jesus, "they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them" (Luke 2:17-18). Their example reminds us that the joy of Christmas isn't meant to stay with us—it's meant to be shared. The world needs to hear this wonderful news!

So, invite your neighbours, coworkers, family, and friends to join us for our Christmas services! Statistics show that when someone receives a personal invitation, they are much more likely to attend.

Take some of the Christmas postcards and invite people to come and hear the good news about Jesus! If you're feeling particularly bold, consider sharing your personal testimony about what Christ's birth means to you.

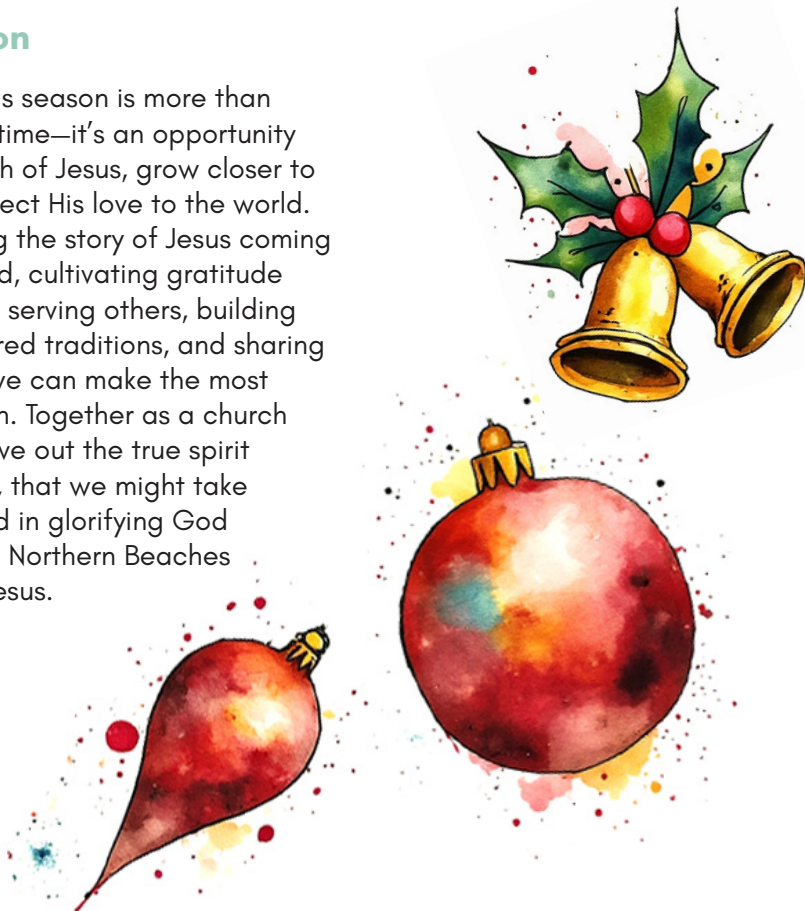
You can also use social media to highlight the true meaning of Christmas, offering encouragement to those who may be feeling lonely or overwhelmed this season. By sharing the good news, we open the door for others to experience the hope and love found in Christ.

Conclusion

Tell us a bit about you and your family.

In 2019 I joined St Faith's, was further trained up in ministry and was sent off to Moore Theological College. Now I am back at St Faith's! I love spending time with children and have done so over many years! Their curious minds are so great, and we can learn much from them too. My experiences with children have included things like Before/After school care, special and mainstream school education, kids church, beach missions and preschool teaching. I love spending time with my two nieces and four nephews, along with my sisters and parents!

Share with us a bit about how you came to know Jesus.

Over my schooling years I learnt about Jesus through scripture lessons and sporadic church visits. In my later high school years and early uni days, the facts that I had learnt about Jesus transformed into a deep understanding and love of Jesus! Through reading the Bible, God enabled me to realise my sinful state and my need for Jesus as my Saviour and Lord. I'm so thankful for youth group leaders, women's minister, friends, Uni Christian group and others who read the Bible with me, helped me work through many questions and care for me through the journey.



You decided to go along to Moore Theological College. What did you enjoy most about studying theology?

In 2022 I started at Moore Theological College. It has been such a privilege to spend time exploring Biblical teaching on things like God's grace, humanity, eschatology, church and sacraments (Lord's supper and Baptism).

What sort of things do you like to do on the weekends or days off?

I love being outside (eg. going for a beach/bush walk, playing tennis, kayaking, having a picnic with friends).

You will be joining our staff team as an Associate Pastor in February. What are you most looking forward to about your new role at St Faith's?

There are many things I am looking forward to! I'm looking forward to encouraging the young women at night church in their walk with Christ, reconnecting with the St Faith's families and meeting new ones, discipling many kids and leaders of the kids (Lighthouse, Kids Church, SRE), and working alongside a fantastic loving ministry team!

THE BAINES FAMILY Goes Global!



Matt Baines and his family are about to move back to Edinburgh, Scotland. We interviewed Matt to find out more about his family's plans.

Q. Why are you moving back to Edinburgh?

A. I (Matt) have accepted a 12-month contract to lecture in Christian Theology at the University of Edinburgh. It's the same institution where I completed my Master's and my PhD.

Q. Why are you taking up this role?

A. It's an opportunity for me to teach theology to undergraduate and postgraduate students at the University. I'll also have the opportunity to conduct some original research on systematic theology and the history of Christianity.

Q. What are you hoping to do at the conclusion of this role?

A. I'm hoping that eventually I will get a permanent position teaching and researching theology in a university.

Q. What are the challenges and opportunities of working at a university?

A. Unlike a church or a Bible college, a university doesn't require its students to hold Christian beliefs. That means that my colleagues and students will come from many faiths and none. The upside of this, is that there will be plenty of opportunities to share Jesus with many people, and to encourage fellow Christians as they seek to grow in their knowledge of God.

Q. What are you looking forward to about this role?

A. I'm looking forward not only to teaching but also to learning. Most of my learning and research has focused on theology in the early church, the Middle Ages and the Reformation and post-Reformation era. This role will help me to expand my knowledge of theology in the modern era. I'm also looking forward to spending more

time on research. Evangelicals tend to leave the writing papers and books about the history of theology to others. I believe there is a lot to be gained by contributing towards scholarship that helps us to understand the history of Christianity more deeply and retrieving the best insights for use today.

Q. What will this move mean for your family?

A. My wife Larissa will have to give up her job and look for work in Scotland. Rachael and Susanna will hopefully go to Flora Stevenson Primary School, where Rachael attended previously. It will be hard saying goodbye to our family and friends here in Australia.

Q. Where will you go to church?

A. We will go to Edinburgh North Church, a Presbyterian church. It's the same church that we used to attend between 2018 and 2023.

Q. What can we be praying for?

A. Please pray for the logistics involved in the move. We have to apply for visas to live and work in the UK. We will also need to find a place to live and get the kids settled into school. Please pray for Larissa to find work. Please also pray for me as I build on existing relationships and form new ones. Pray finally that we would all make much of Jesus.

Square One Camp

CLUB UPDATE 2024

We thought you might like to know what we have been up to this year. Our group of lovely ladies meet every Thursday to quilt, knit, sew and chat and at morning tea we have a short devotion.

Last year we were saving quilts waiting for the Adolescent and Young Adults Hospice (AYAH) to open in Manly. They are in a beautiful setting overlooking the bush and the harbour in the old Manly hospital grounds. They were thrilled when we delivered 30 beautiful quilts earlier in the year.

We have been providing quilts to Bear Cottage for over 20 years. Each child (or parent) can select a quilt to keep. We delivered another 16 in November and the staff are always happy to greet us.

The students we were sponsoring for their schooling at Ibulanku Trust school in Uganda both graduated from primary school last year and we now have 2 new students.

Dawn(in her 90's) was no longer able to join us on Thursdays but she was keeping busy at home making the pretty skirts for the Christmas Boxes. Our ladies also made lots of cloth bags, dresses and 60 knitted teddies for the boxes! When she passed away a few months ago her family donated her sewing items to our group and with other donations of fabrics and wool our crates are overflowing!

We are now supporting the Sydney Wildlife and Rescue Centre by utilising fabrics not suitable for quilting. We have made snake bags, snake beds,



possum and wombat pouches, joey bags, basket liners (using old T-shirts) and crochet bird nests.

Last month I saw 2 baby wombats, a baby possum and even a snake in pouches we had made!

Also this year we decided to provide quilts for baptisms at St Faith's, not just for babies but for older children and even adults. Each week our ladies put \$2 in the kitty. After we have purchased our needs and the money box is overflowing we decide which charities to support.

Our recipients in November were "Mercy Ships" and Fred Hollows "Vision Australia" and earlier in the year "Rural Aid" and the Cancer Council. Our final meeting this year is a Christmas morning tea picnic at Middle Creek on 5th December. We will resume 16th January.

New members are always welcome. We all wish you a blessed and joyous Christmas season.

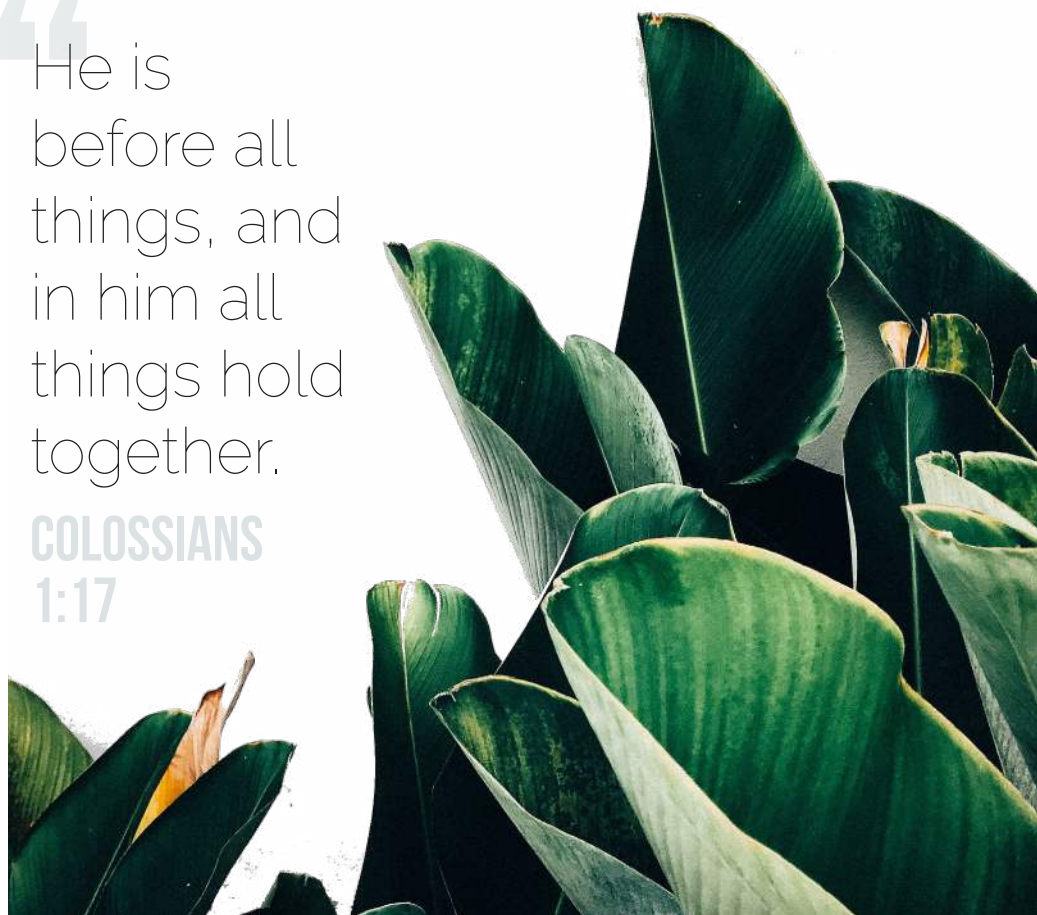
