Dear Church,

Welcome along to St Faith's if you're visiting us for the summer while on holidays, looking for a new church home, or you're here every week as part of our church family. Happy New Year to you all! A new year for most people comes with new goals, new targets, and maybe even a few new year's resolutions, but our vision and goal here at St Faith's, under God, remains the same....

We want to see a Northern Beaches that knows Jesus by making disciples who grow to maturity in Christ for God's glory.

To that end, knowing that God matures us through his word and by his Spirit, we've got a great year in God's word lined up that we pray will help us grow to maturity in Christ together. I thought it'd be helpful to give you a bit of a snapshot of where we're heading for the year:

Teaching Series 2025

Summer Series A Fresh Start

As we kick off 2025, we're going to be asking God to refresh our hearts for the year ahead. To that end, we've got a series of sermons that we pray will help us to: (1) rediscover the joy of being in relationship with Jesus; (2) renew our vision for God's church across generations; (3) set a rhythm of rest amidst the busyness of life in the year ahead, and; (4) reconnect with our community as a vital aspect of spiritual health and refreshment for the year ahead. We pray these studies in God's word will help us with a fresh start for the new year.

Term 1 (February to April) *Matthew 8-12*

This section of Matthew's Gospel begins with the words "When he came down from the mountain..." (Matthew 8:1). The events of the Matthew 8-12 take place in the shadow of the Sermon on the Mount (Matthew 5–7), which we explored last year. As we saw last year, Jesus' Sermon on the Mount is many things: a recapitulation of the law of God, a manifesto for God's Kingdom, but it's also a character profile of the true Son of God. The Sermon answers the question: "What does the true Son of God look like?" Matthew 8-12 can be read as this search for the true Son of God. We look forward to exploring this together.

Term 2 (May to June) The Book of Numbers

In 2021 our Old Testament focus was the book of Genesis, followed by the journey of God's people through the book of Exodus in 2022 and 2023 - seeing the personal nature of God calling his people and leading them from slavery in Egypt to the edge of the Promised Land. In 2024 we dived head-first into the book of Leviticus - a book full of instructions for sacrificial offerings, cleanliness and other religious ceremonies for God's people in the Old Testament and we saw how this was a foreshadow of the work of Christ. In 2025, we plan to continue our journey through the Torah (first five books of the Old Testament) as we study together the book of Numbers.

The book of Numbers is one of the lessstudied books of the Bible, but we're not going to let that stop us because it contains a wealth of wisdom for the people of God. It tells us the story of the Israelites' journey through the wilderness to the Promised Land and there is much for us to learn from it, even today.

Term 3 (July to September) *Ephesians*

The world is crying out for wisdom. For millions of people, the world feels broken. Expectations are disappointed; tragedies strike; relationships break up; families disintegrate; hopes are smashed. Life is broken and needs to be fixed. But how? All too often disappointment leads to bitterness, hurt to hostility, and cynicism morphs into aggression. People search for answers in a variety of places – through philosophy, self-help, or fleeting pleasures – but these solutions are only temporary, and their benefits are short-lived. What's the solution?

Ephesians has the answer. Ephesians presents a wisdom which transcends ordinary human understanding, a wisdom rooted in the eternal purposes of God, which offers true guidance and hope for a fractured world. Paul reminds believers that true wisdom is not of this world, but is a gift of the Spirit of God, who reveals the mysteries of the gospel, showing a broken world that ultimate healing and restoration come only through Christ. This wisdom, when embraced, has the power to transform lives, heal relationships, and bring peace to a world that so desperately needs it. I can't wait to look at this letter of Paul's together as a church community.

Term 4 (October to December) Commitment Series + Advent

Finally in term four, we will spend a month in a Commitment Series (what it is we're committed to and why) and a month of Advent leading up to our Christmas services and celebrations.

I'm excited for what God, by his Spirit and through his word, will be teaching us in the year ahead and I pray that it is both enriching, challenging, corrective, equipping and comforting (2 Tim 3:16) for us all as we continue to strive to please God in living lives that are obedient to his word.

Well, you've survived another crazy December and hopefully had some good times celebrating the birth of our Lord Jesus over Christmas and now it's January!! Another new year - 2025!!

What does your January look like? Does it include some time off? A holiday or break away from the usual routines and busyness that often make up the rest of our year! Hopefully life may be a little slower! There may even be some time for reflection and pausing for a moment to think about how we might make 2025 different to 2024. I often have grand plans of what the new year coming in will look like. Maybe you're the same. Maybe you are a new year's resolutions sort of person - 2025 will be the year of exercising every day, reading my bible every day, praying every day, eating better, catching up more regularly with friends or family or whatever your particular choice of new good habit might be?

Don't you agree that as our lives get busier and busier, time becomes our most precious commodity. It's the one thing we can never get back. And we know, don't we – that life here is short! If we don't intentionally make the time to spend with others, get to know them, then another year, or 2 or 5 or 10 can go by and we are no closer to each other. Our relationships continue to be surface level or superficial and so doing "real life" with one another becomes all the more difficult, because we don't actually know people very well at all!

Well I have been pondering what my January might look like and it got me thinking about whether I may be able to take that bit of extra time, the extra time that comes from not having all the other "things" on in January – that slower pace to actually invest intentionally in those relationships that maybe I don't have as much time for during the year. Often we catch up with old friends and family and that's awesome! But I wondered if January is also possibly a good time to think about intentionally investing time in our church family?? And by investing time, I just mean having people over for a meal – opening our homes – or catching up with someone over coffee, in the park, go for a walk??

As followers of Jesus, we want to invest time in one another. Loving God and loving one another are the 2 great commandments. Opening our homes, showing hospitality to one another, spending quality time together, is a great way of loving one another!

We see God's people loving one another in this way, throughout the bible but particularly in the early church. Acts 2 tells us that the community of new believers, "devoted themselves to the apostles teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer.... They broke bread in their homes and ate together with glad and sincere hearts, praising God and enjoying the favour of all the people. And the Lord added to their number daily those who were being saved."

Paul tells us of people that showed him hospitality throughout his missionary journeys - there was Lydia in Philippi (Acts 16), the jailer in Philippi (Acts 16), the Ephesian elders (Acts 20), Publius at Malta (Acts 28), Gaius in Rome (Romans 16) - to name a few.



There are a number of verses throughout the letters to the churches in the New Testament that also speak of the importance of showing hospitality to one another:

Romans 12:13 Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practice hospitality.

1 Timothy 5:10 and is well known for her good deeds, such as bringing up children, showing hospitality, washing the feet of the Lord's people, helping those in trouble and devoting herself to all kinds of good deeds.

Hebrews 13:2 Do not forget to show hospitality to strangers, for by so doing some people have shown hospitality to angels without knowing it.

1 Peter 4:9 Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling.

3 John 1:8 We ought therefore to show hospitality to such people so that we may work together for the truth.

We are encouraged to look out for one another and offer hospitality to not just our friends and people we like but those who may be doing it tough. Those who are lonely, those who may be different, those who may be harder to love, harder to hang out with, a little socially awkward??

I love the Hebrews verse above that says that we may be hanging out with angels and not even know it! How cool is that!! So, I thought what about Holiday Hospitality?? I know it sounds a bit cringe but stick with me! What if we all were a bit more intentional over January about inviting one another over for lunch, dinner, breakfast, morning or afternoon tea - whatever works for you! With a bit more time, hanging out with one another but not just the people we would usually hang with but some new or different people from church. Or invite some church people over with some of your non-Christian friends - start building connections between people that may make inviting them along to other things throughout the year a bit easier.

It'd be awesome to have small groups of people gathering regularly throughout different times in January to catch up and enjoy fellowship together!

Let's make 2025 the year where it becomes the norm to open our homes, hang out with one another more and love one another deeply as we seek to follow and love our Lord Jesus together!

Pray for wisdom and insight as Irwan plans and drafts two semesters worth of training materials "Foundation in Theology and Ministry" for the students. Give thanks for the great Gumnut team and the welcoming environment they provide for the children and families. Pray for wisdom and energy for the Director Bec who oversees all things at the kindy. Pray the new children starting at Gumnut will settle in quickly and adjust well to the new routine.
WED 15	Praise God for his provision of THE COMMUNITY PANTRY last year. Give thanks for our wonderful volunteers who serve in so many ways. Pray for each of the guests, that they will open their hearts to Jesus or continue to draw closer to him if they have accepted him into their lives. 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NARRABEEN Indigenous History

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On Sunday 19th January we will be spending time in each of our services praying for Indigenous Peoples. 'Aboriginal Sunday' as it has come to be known, began as a call by Aboriginal Christian leader, Yorta Yorta man, pastor and advocate, William Cooper. On 26 January 1938, Aboriginal leaders, including William Cooper, met for a Day of Mourning, seeking equality and full citizenship – which took a further 30 years.

Australian churches were then asked to set aside the Sunday before 26 January as Aboriginal Sunday, a day for Christians to act in solidarity with Aboriginal peoples and the injustices being experienced. In the lead up to this, we thought it might be helpful to consider some 'local' Indigenous history.

In our local community on the Northern Beaches, the Gai-maragal and Garigal peoples, also known as the saltwater peoples, have been living here for thousands of years. Narrabeen borders with other clan groups which are part of Guringai Country and the wider Eora Nation. At our local Narrabeen Beach, several 'middens' can be found. Middens are accumulations of various shells by Aboriginal people who collected, cooked and ate shellfish as part of their daily living.

Turimetta Beach was known for conducting Women's Business. Women were taught about knowledge systems and responsibilities and gave birth to their children here. In years gone by, a thriving Fairy Penguin colony lived on the rock platform between Narrabeen and Turimetta Beaches.

Oxford Falls was known for its Men's Business, where men celebrated culture through storytelling, song, art and dance. In the Gai-maragal language, 'warami' means welcome!
