Here's some of what I reported to the Parish Council for our March meeting –

Anglicare Dinner – Domestic Family Violence

A couple of weeks ago, Yvette and I attended an Anglicare fundraising dinner with some other St Faith's members at St Matthew's Anglican Church in Manly. We heard about some of the good work that Anglicare is involved in with victims of domestic and family violence.

On the night, \$82,000 was raised to help support this work at Anglicare. From this same event last year, our church purchased copies of "Renew" – a resource designed to help victims of domestic abuse navigate their next steps.

Copies of this continue to be available in the foyer for people who may be facing these difficult circumstances. Over the coming weeks you may also notice some new signage in the bathrooms which is designed to inform people and help support victims of domestic family violence – some of whom might be in our own community.

Rosemary, Lyndal and I also had the opportunity to visit the new "Narrabeen House" – run by the Northern Beaches Women's Shelter. St Faith's, through a generous benefactor, will be making a financial contribution to the work that NBWS in

our wider community, and we felt that it was a good opportunity to make a connection with them. Their CEO and team of volunteers do an amazing work caring for vulnerable people in our community.

Staff Update

We have a number of positions that we are now looking to fill, with the recent retirement of both Tony Bradford and Colin Sheehan. After meeting with the RSL Lifecare Village, I am pleased to confirm that they would like to continue partnering with St Faith's, which is wonderful news. I have also had a couple of initial meetings with potential candidates for our vacant Associate Pastor position. I would appreciate your prayers in each of these, and for God's wisdom as we look at recruiting new staff for our team.

Clarke Street Traffic Flow

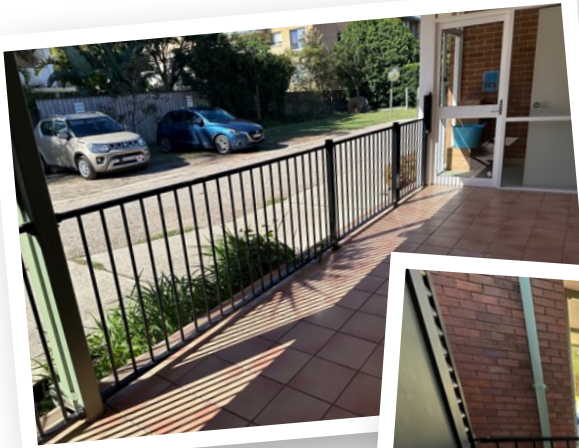
Peak times at church are a bit chaotic, to say the least, and our neighbours aren't particularly pleased at the moment! As a result, we want to trial a few changes to encourage better traffic flow for our church members, particularly during peak times...

First, we'd love you to treat Clarke Street as a 'one way street' with traffic flowing in an easterly direction. For those of you who are arriving from the south, we'd encourage you to turn left at Wetherill Street (before Clarke), then make your way into Clarke Street.

Secondly, you may also notice that we've installed some 'left turn only' signs at the carpark exit. Even if you need to head south after church, head out onto Pittwater Road, take a left into Mactier and turn around on the roundabout back to the lights - it'll take an extra 60 seconds - but will make a big difference for the flow of things overall.

With these two suggestions in place, and a new 'Kiss & Drop' system for Soulies parents, we think this will help the traffic flow better overall. Below is a map that's been marked up to give an indication of the proposed flow of our new system.





Safety Fencing

You may also notice a slight change in the fencing on the northern balcony of our church building. We've added in some fencing for those cheeky little runners at our 10am and 4pm service to provide an added layer of safety from the carpark. Thanks Dave Lawson for installing them for us!

Our **Easter Services** are coming up on Good Friday (18th April) and Easter Sunday (20th April). **We will meet at our usual service times on both days.** Please be praying about who you can invite along to our services.

Numbers?

WHY NUMBERS?

A Journey towards the Promised Land

Those who have been around for a little while at St Faith's know that our team give deep thought and consideration to the parts of the Bible that we look at each year. We think it most useful to be fed spiritually from a 'balanced diet' of Old and New Testament. In our Old Testament studies over the last five years, we've looked at Genesis, Exodus, Leviticus, and back in 2019 we looked at Deuteronomy. The first five books of the Bible (known by some as the 'Pentateuch') are foundational in understanding the rest of the Bible!

While they are five separate books there's a unified message throughout them which announces foundational doctrines for the rest of the Bible – sin, nature, humanity, suffering, promise, blessing, and hope. The book of Numbers is our final instalment (for now) in our teaching on the Pentateuch!

Now, you might ask why? Numbers might seem like a boring list of names and 'numbers' but let me assure you, it's far from boring – there's life or death survival, food falling from the sky, water bursting from a rock, fire pillars, spies, and giant enemies! It's anything but boring!

So as we approach our series in May and June, I thought it'd be helpful to give a simple overview of what we're about to encounter in Numbers....

Context

First, we need to remember that Egypt had enslaved the nation of Israel for 430 years, but God provided a powerful exit from this oppression and now God's people are free (that was our Exodus series in 2022/2023).

However, God's people are exhausted and scared—they've only begun to live as free people and have heaps to learn! So, God's been camping with them at Mount Sinai for a year, teaching them to relate with him and to one another (that was our Leviticus series in 2024).

Now, he plans to lead them on a long journey toward the land he promised their ancestors (that was our Genesis series in 2021). Before they leave the mountain, God orders a headcount – a census to number all the people. All this counting of people gives the book its title – Numbers. But more than just counting people, the book of Numbers teaches us about Israel's tough journey

from Mount Sinai to the edge of the promised land. Will the Israelites, whom God rescued, learn to trust him as he leads them through the wilderness and into the land? Or will they choose another way?

Our study booklets (which will be available on the website at Easter), will take us through some of the details – but for now, here’s an overview of the book of Numbers to whet our appetite, and get us a little more oriented to the direction we’re heading in term 2 together....

Chapters 1-12

Preparing for the journey...

As the preparations to hit the road begin, God arranges their camp in a formation that places the Tabernacle, the site of his presence, right in the middle. God wants to live with the Israelites in the land he promised, and he also wants to live every day with them while they trudge through the wilderness. He wants them to trust him through their hardships, but they struggle to rely on God. Sound familiar? They complain, despise the good things he provides, and even wish they were living as slaves back in Egypt.

Chapters 13-25

Refusing to trust God...

Full of fear, complaints, and doubts, God’s people continue their journey toward the promised land. When they finally reach the border and send out spies to scope the land, some of those spies return with reports of giant enemies – so they refuse to enter the occupied land. Two of those spies,

Caleb and Joshua, try to convince the people to trust that God will provide for them in the land – but they fail and God’s people conclude that they’d rather die in the wilderness than enter the land! So, God gives them what they want, assigning them 40 years of camping (can you imagine?!) in the wilderness until the whole generation dies. However, Caleb, Joshua, and the children of the Exodus generation will remain. The journey to the land holds out hope still....

Chapters 26-36

Preparing to enter....again

The last section of Numbers begins with the next generation camped at the Jordan River, right at the edge of the land God promised to their ancestors. Again, we see that God calls for a census (Numbers). He gives his people instructions on land divisions and laws on how to live to ensure that the new land will not be oppressive like Egypt. If the people follow God’s commands, they’ll be able to enjoy the promised land and all of its goodness forever.

So, by the end of Numbers, we’re left to wonder – will this generation of God’s people learn from their people’s past mistakes? Will they trust God and his promises to bring them to a land of blessing? Will we, today, through Jesus, do the same?

SHARING IN CHRIST'S LOVE FOR EVERYONE

Living in the beautiful Northern Beaches, it's easy to feel like everyone here has what they need. Since we rarely, if ever, see our fellow brothers and sisters going without food, clothing, or shelter, it might sometimes seem there's not much work to be done amongst our community.

You're probably familiar with how Jesus said that on "the last day", when the righteous ask God how it was that they "fed or gave something to drink" to the King of Heaven himself, he will answer:

"... whatever you did for one of the least of these brothers and sisters of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25:40)

Looking around at St Faith's, the truth is that you can see many examples of people reaching out to others in need. In the people we contact in our everyday lives. Through regular programs such as **The Community Pantry, Play Group** and **ESL**. And in other church groups where we might encounter the so called "least of" our brothers and sisters; the definition of whom is just anyone who might be in need, at any given time.

But maybe you're not as familiar with **Jesus Club**, a group that meets at

Clarke Street on the first Monday of every month to share fellowship with adults living with intellectual or learning disability. Started in 2017 with the help of Jesus Club Ministries (see jesusclub.org.au for more information), God has been using this small group to bring The Gospel to those who might not otherwise be able to hear it at a regular church meeting.

(Matthew 25:40)

Underpinning what we do is a biblical conviction that **Jesus' message of love is for everyone** - that to take the Great Commission seriously means striving to make it accessible to all. Just as neither financial means nor language nor nationality should exclude someone from hearing the Good News, neither should intellectual capacity. His love is for all of us, and that guides both the purpose of the ministry, and the way we go about it.

From my involvement in Jesus Club, I've experienced a profound way to love Jesus, by simply sharing Christ-centred fellowship with others who are hungry to connect. As we talk about what Jesus has done for us and the way he shows us to live, we've built lasting friendships together.

Through these wonderful relationships, Jesus has in turn taught me about himself – the deep and abiding qualities of his heart, his grace, his abundance, and his mercy.

At Jesus Club we start with a few **games** to break the ice – to have fun and laugh together. Then we sing a few of our favourite **Jesus songs**, after which we're well and truly ready to sit for the quieter part of the evening: sharing our personal highs and lows and **praying**, then listening to a **short Jesus talk** from one of the leaders, prepared from the easy-to-understand modules provided by the Jesus Club Ministries team.

We finish with **"buddy groups"** where we use the provided worksheets to guide a more personal chat through our topic as we enjoy a **light supper** together.

Jesus Club is Gospel work, and it does take our time and energy. But it's hugely rewarding, and for me, has been life-transforming. So, if you share God's heart for people in need, know that we do need **new helpers**. One of the pastors would be happy to answer your questions or put you in touch with me – and in most cases we're happy to have you along as a visitor so you can experience what it's all about and see if this beautiful ministry might be for you.

In the meantime, we'd appreciate your prayers – for **growth** and new members, for resilience and stamina for our leaders, and that above all, that those who come along would know Jesus, accept him as King of their hearts, and learn what it means to be part of His Family.

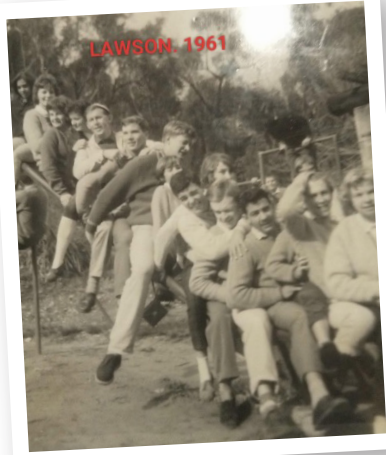
in the 60's

= Soulies in 2025!

The story of Soulies Summer Camp in the February Community Mag reminded me of our House Party weekends in my youth.

My family moved to Collaroy from Cremorne in 1959 and I changed school (2nd year = year 8) to Narrabeen Girls High and moved church to St Faith's. Sunday School wasn't the same time as church - it was held between the two morning services. It went up to end of 2nd year Highschool. Parents rarely drove us, it was either walk or go by bus.



A school friend invited me to Friday Night Fellowship, a group from teens youth attended the Sunday Evening church where the choir sang. The group was co-ordinated by the Curate (the Assistant Minister) with help of older youth leaders. We had a great time singing choruses, Bible stories, games, activities, supper and time to get to know each other. Sometimes we had outings at the weekend, picnics, bush walks, scavenger hunts, and later car trials.





Every year there was a House Party – a group weekend away together. My first one was in September 1961. We went to Lawson in the Blue Mountains leaving Friday night by train and returning Sunday afternoon. There were around 20 youths, house parents and the Curate. We walked from the station to our accommodation – a cottage converted for groups to stay. The lounge room was the meeting room where there was some seating otherwise you sat on the floor. The dining room was cramped with two long tables. There were bedrooms for the house parents or clergy and two slightly larger rooms, one for girls and one for boys with 3 or 4 triple bunks!!

The programs were much the same and included singing, prayers, activities, bible studies, skits and games.

I also recall that the church ran an equivalent to Chillout. It was called the Daily Vacation Bible School (DVBS) and was held over three days in the school holidays for primary kids. I assisted once on my nursing days off.

I hope you enjoy this flashback of St. Faith's youth activities.
